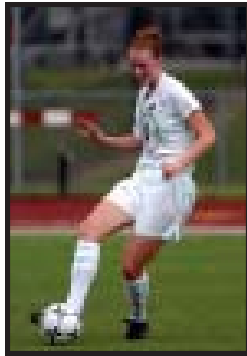

Around The Mizzou Sports Park

Soccer

The Tigers capped off an exciting and competitive season with a 2-1 sudden death overtime loss to Colorado at the Big XII tournament in San Antonio. Finishing with a 9-10-1 record against the nation's best, the team endured several close contests and tight finishes.



Cross Country

The women's team took a 9th place ranking and NCAA Midwest Regional title into the NCAA Championships and came out with its best finish in twenty years finishing 11th. Rebecca Wilmes earned her 2nd Midwest Coach of the year award for her work with the women. The men earned an at-large individual bid to the NCAA Championships.



Football

Junior defensive back AJ Kincade secured the football for an exciting season-finale victory over Iowa State and ended the roller coaster season for the Tigers. After a quick start, the Tigers stalled mid-season and finished with a 5-6 record. The Tiger defense stayed at the head of the pack in the Big XII throughout the season and was one of the best in the nation.

Volleyball

The final USA Today/CSTV Coaches' poll ranked the Tigers at #24, one of the programs best finishes. A 20-9 record and 2nd round NCAA tournament appearance are emblematic of why. Mizzou hosted 1st and 2nd round tournament contests for the first time in history and the 1st round win over Arkansas was the second postseason win in history.



Women's Golf

Coach Cooper's crew took the momentum of last spring into the fall and recorded four top four finishes. Senior, Maria Ohlsson and junior, Denise Knaebel will look to continue that stellar play into the spring.

Men's Golf

In their first season under coach Mark Leroux, the men spent the fall working on their game and playing against tough competition. At the Nelsons, a tournament hosted by the Stanford Golf Club, the men recorded the 3rd best score in school history on their way to a fourth place finish.

Women's Tennis

A dominating sweep at the Drake Invitational capped the fall season for the tennis squad as they prepare for a busy spring schedule. In Des Moines, Mizzou snatched the A, B, and C single titles as well as the A and B doubles titles. Senior Katka Sevcikova finished the fall 14-1 with three tournament titles.

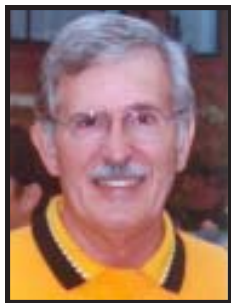

Varsity M Salutes First Female Letterwinner



Sue Gerard

At ninety years old, you might not expect Sue Meyers Gerard to be remembered by most Varsity M letterwinners. But as the first female athlete to earn a letter at MU, she has carved a place for herself in the memories of many at MU and in Columbia.

When Gerard (BJ 1936, M Ed 1941) attended MU in the late 30's, athletes were required to earn points in a sport in order to receive a letter. Men were required to earn 100

points. Female athletes, on the other hand, were required to earn 1000 points. That seemingly insurmountable number didn't stop Gerard from reaching her goal. As a matter of fact, she was the first female to earn 1000 points in just three years of competition, and was the only "M" women's club member during her senior year. Gerard was catcher on her "Independent" baseball team, a forward on her basketball team, participated in the breast stroke, back crawl and relay on the swim team, competed on the archery and rifle teams and was a member of the *Mermaids* swim team. And for those years of competition, Sue proudly earned her letter.

Following graduation from MU, Gerard spent 33 years at Columbia Christian College, now Columbia College. She taught physical education and recreation courses with an emphasis in swimming and life saving. Over her 33 years, Gerard taught and certified more than 2,000 American Red Cross senior life savers and several hundred water safety instructors. She coached several intramural sports and sponsored *The Dolphins*, a synchronized swimming group which presented an annual water show for the college and community.

Today, Gerard could be called a local celebrity. In 2004, she became the first inductee into Columbia College's Athletic Hall of Fame. A lifelong resident of mid-Missouri, she and her late husband raised two children. She has authored *Granny's Notes* for the Columbia Daily Tribune for the past nine years. Her other writing projects include articles for Reader's Digest, Ebony and Better Homes and Gardens plus two books, *Just Leave The Dishes* and *My First 84 Years*. Topping it all off are numerous writing honors and awards.

The Varsity M Association proudly celebrates the accomplishments of Sue Gerard, the University of Missouri's first female letterwinner.

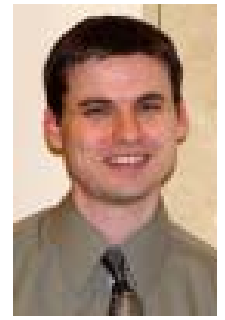

BRADY DEATON NAMED MU CHANCELLOR

In October, Brady J. Deaton was appointed chancellor of the University of Missouri-Columbia making him the 21st Chief Executive Officer for MU since its founding in 1839.

ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Todd McCubbin has been named the executive director of the MU Alumni Association and associate vice chancellor for alumni relations. In his new role, McCubbin directs the operational and financial activities of the alumni association.

LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS

Do you live outside of Missouri and have a son or daughter nearing college age? If so, please be aware of the Mizzou Heritage Award. This scholarship is an automatic award that allows out-of-state students to attend MU and pay in-state tuition rates. These savings are typically equivalent to about \$9,000 per academic year! The criteria for this award are:

- Student whose biological or adopted parent graduated from the University of Missouri-Columbia.
- Top 25 percent of high school graduating class.
- Composite ACT score of 27 or combined SAT score of 1200.
- U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident AND Non-Missouri resident.
- Enroll at MU the first semester after high school.

STUDENTS AND ALUMNI SHARE EXPERIENCES

The Mizzou connection opens a lot of doors.
